Step 1 (continued): Generate Full Page Copy with Layout Suggestions

Optional: Refine Sections as Needed

Step 2: Build Your Page Section by Section

Now that your copy and layout plan are finalized, it's time to start building. You'll add code into the AttractWell page editor one section at a time, using the structure ChatGPT gave you in Step 1.

Before you begin:

- Open the note or document where you saved your final copy and layout suggestions

Step 3: (continued) Apply Design and Finishing Touches

Working with large sections of code?

To avoid this:

- Upload the file in your ChatGPT window
- Use the following prompt instead of pasting the code:
